Fall of 2004 brought an historic landmark for the Foundation in the first expansion of the scholarship program to universities other than the University of Texas and Texas A&M University.

In 2003, for the first time in its history, the Board of Directors approved the expansion of the Terry Foundation Scholarship Program to the University of Houston and to Texas State University-San Marcos. The first Scholars for UH and Texas State were selected at interviews in April, 2004 and began college last fall. The Foundation is pleased to welcome these outstanding institutions to the Terry program.

In April, the Foundation selected a total of 169 new 2005 Scholars. We are indebted to our Scholars and Scholar Alumni who joined the members of our Board of Directors in serving on the panels to select the new class. This new class, when combined with our existing

Scholars, will bring the total number of active Terry Scholars to more than six hundred students.

The spring of 2005 also brought graduation to 111 Terry Scholars, many of whom graduated with honors. They join a growing body of Scholar Alumni that now numbers over 750.

On behalf of the Board of Directors and the Foundation staff, we would also like to thank the staffs at Texas State University-San Marcos, the University of Houston, Texas A&M University, and the University of Texas for their invaluable assistance during our annual interview process in Austin, Houston and Dallas.

HISTORY OF THE FOUNDATION

"Success is the attainment of the goals you've set for yourself in life." -Howard L. Terry

he Terry Foundation's goal is to improve and develop the State of Texas by assisting Texas students to attend the state's finest public universities. The Foundation hopes that these students will have a significant impact on the future leadership of the state and nation. To achieve this goal, the Foundation awards full scholarships to students who meet the high standards set by the Founders.

What began in 1986 as a small scholarship program is now the largest private source of scholarships for the University of Texas, Texas A&M University, the University of Houston and Texas State University-San Marcos, with over 600 Terry Scholars enrolled. But its origin was neither large nor legendary – and as humble and low-profile as the Founders whose name it bears.

The Terry Scholarship Program was born of a desire of Howard and Nancy Terry to help young people to help themselves. A long-time resident of Houston, Howard Terry had been active for many years in banking, construction, real estate, and oil & gas. With profound business success over the decades and their family's needs met, the Terrys developed a growing desire to give back to the community and, specifically, to help young people to reach their goals in higher education.

In 1986, the Terrys began considering a variety of options in their desire to make a lasting contribution to the future of Texas higher education. After evaluating ideas as varied as university campus construction projects and endowed-chair faculty positions, the Terrys were still not satisfied. Knowing that universities are more

than buildings and classrooms, Howard Terry had repeatedly declined to allow the universities to honor his previous contributions by placing his name on campus structures: "Mortar and bricks will eventually be torn down," he reasoned. The Terrys believed, in the long term, that a university, like the state it represents, is only as good as the educated citizens it produces. Thus was born a desire to invest in the students who would attend the public colleges and universities in Texas.

The Terrys' desire to help young people was influenced greatly by Howard Terry's own college experience: he had attended the University of Texas on an athletic scholarship, where he was captain of the football team and graduated in 1938. His family origins in Cameron, Texas were modest and it was only through the generosity of others that his college education had been made possible. Mr. Terry never forgot the helping hand that he had received in attending college and was determined to extend that same help to a new generation of students.

After seeking counsel from sources that included former UT coach Darrell Royal (an original Foundation Board Member) and

Houston attorney Rhett Campbell (Board Member since inception and now Board Chair), the Terrys determined that their most lasting contribution would be through a perpetual endowment that would provide college scholarships for students who had demonstrated the capacity to become outstanding future leaders and who needed financial assistance to achieve their goals in higher education. From this simple concept, the Terry Foundation was created in 1986 to be the source of a perpetual scholarship program.

The first scholarship recipients, known since then as "Terry Scholars," were selected at interviews held in the spring of 1987. That original class of seventeen

1987 Scholars were joined in the 1988-1989 academic year by 17 additional recipients. Over the years, the number of Scholars selected has increased, with the most recent Spring 2005 interviews having resulted in the selection of 169 new freshman Scholars. These recipients will join the upper-class Scholars to number over 600 Terry Scholars enrolled for the 2005-2006 academic year.

During the first seventeen years of the Foundation's history, Scholars attended only the University of Texas or Texas A&M University. In the fall of 2004, the Foundation Scholarship Program expanded for the first time, when Terry

Scholars were named at the University of Houston and at Texas State University-San Marcos. Strategic future plans call for the program's ultimate expansion to other public universities in Texas.

Since its inception, the Terry Scholarship Program has assisted over 1,300 Texas college students to achieve their goals in higher education. The Foundation Board oversees an endowment now in excess of \$125 million and includes two members who are Terry Scholar Alumni. Chartered to exist into perpetuity, the

Foundation is designed to continue in the future to provide a greater number of scholarships each year.


Howard and Nancy Terry continue to be active participants in the Scholarship Program that bears their name. It has become larger than they ever imagined, fulfilling in the process their dreams of making a difference in the lives of students across the state.

Despite his extraordinary success in ventures that made the Terry Foundation possible, Howard Terry observes that "the Terry Foundation is the most important thing I've done in my life, because it's enabled me to help more people than I would have ever been able to do otherwise."

THE TERRY SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

Criteria

he Terry Foundation awards scholarships to Texas high school seniors who have been accepted for admission to the University of Texas at Austin, Texas A&M University at College Station, the University of Houston, or Texas State University-San Marcos. To be selected to receive a scholarship, potential Terry Scholars must demonstrate academic excellence, leadership, and financial need.

Terry Scholars are distinguished by a deep-rooted desire to enrich the general welfare of the community and an established record of leadership. In order to select Scholars with the greatest potential for success, the Foundation's selection committees focus on candidates with a demonstrated history of involvement in activities, outstanding scholastic achievement, and a well-rounded personality marked by a desire to succeed.

Nominations for Terry Scholarship awards are accepted only from the designated offices at the University of Texas at Austin, Texas A&M University at College Station, the University of Houston, or Texas State University-San Marcos. Nominations are not accepted from any other source.

The Selection Process

Each year in April, the Terry Foundation announces the new class of Terry Scholars after an intense two-step selection process. Early each spring, the universities nominate candidates from the freshman class that will matriculate the next fall. In selecting nominations, the universities adhere to the selection criteria guidelines established by the Terry Foundation.

While the number of nominations and subsequent scholarships has grown substantially since the first scholarships were awarded in 1987, the process to win a scholarship has remained intensely competitive. In selecting finalists, the selection committees at the affiliated universities are limited to a small fraction of the thousands of applications received.

The Foundation administration invites the finalists to formal interviews conducted each spring concurrently in Austin, Houston and Dallas. Finalists meet with a six-member panel consisting of members of the Foundation Board of Directors, Alumni Scholars and current Terry Scholars. The interview panels make the final selections and new Scholars are notified prior to May 1st of the interview year.

In April 2005, the eleven interview panels met wirh 352 finalists for the final selection process. Of those finalists, 169 were selected for Terry Scholarship Awards.

The Stipend

The Terry Scholarship Award holds the potential to be a full, four-year stipend. Initially, the scholarship is awarded for a Scholar's first year of college and is renewed annually at the discretion of the Board of Directors. In order to continue as a Terry Scholar, a student must maintain a cumulative 2.5 GPA, meet the requirements for mandatory attendance at specific Terry Foundation events, and fulfill other reporting requirements.

The Terry Foundation seeks to provide adequate financial support for each Terry Scholar so that students may concentrate on academics and college-related activities, without having to incur any debt to finance their education. In addition, the Scholarship Program is designed to eliminate the need for Scholars to work during the college years.

The amount of the stipend is based on the full cost to attend the universities, including tuition, fees, books, on-campus room and board, and miscellaneous expenses. Over the years, the amount of the stipend has increased each year due to rises in cost of living and tuition. The actual specific amount of the stipend will vary for each Scholar, depending on other scholarship awards and the Scholar's family's ability to contribute to the cost of college.

Funding

The Terry Scholarship Program is funded by the earnings of an endowment that has been provided solely by the Founders and is managed by the Terry Foundation. The current endowment is slightly in excess of \$125 million. The Foundation is structured to exist into perpetuity and anticipates additional growth based on incremental endowment by the Founders.

Jim's research has focused mainly on the interaction between seawater and submarine volcanoes. With over 300 days of shiptime to his name, he has descended in a submersible to around 2.5 km deep in the North Pacific, bounced around in a typhoon off Guam in the Western Pacific, and measured pollution coming our of the Amazon river hundreds of miles out in the Atlantic. His most recent expedition took place off the coast of Ireland on the *JOIDES Resolution*, the drillship operated by Texas A&M.

Jim is married to a fellow Texan and has one child, who was hiking on active volcanoes before his third birthday.

Alan's enterprise is not a typical ranch; Paidom Meats markets its products as organic and pasture-raised and is about one-tenth the size of most ag organizations in the area, run with only two employees (Alan and his wife). Their initial herd of 11 cows has grown immensely and now includes lambs, chickens, goats, and layers on land that is certified organic. What started with annual sales of a few hundred dollars in 1994 has grown to a quarter million this year.

Alan still makes a few speaking engagements for ranching and marketing classes at universities, but reports that his greatest joys are walking his land, making dinner with his wife Heather, and wrestling with their son Tanner.

After summa cum laude graduation from A&M, Cynthia Brown entered Baylor College of Medicine, where she graduated with honors in 1999. Since that time, she has been at the Johns Hopkins University Hospital in Baltimore, where she completed her residency in 2004. Cynthia was named an Assistant Chief of Service (chief resident) for the year 2003-04, during which time she was responsible for leading and teaching a group of 30 interns during their first year of medical training. Of this year as a chief resident, Cynthia says, "This was the most rewarding and exhausting year of my life, and extraordinarily fulfilling."

Cynthia is currently pursuing further medical training in a fellowship program in Pulmonary and Critical Care Medicine at Johns Hopkins. She is focusing her career on research in improving the quality of life of patients suffering from emphysema, but also maintains a clinical practice caring for patients with lung disease.

ouston and the University of Houston have grown together over the past 78 years into international leaders. Today the University of Houston is the country's most diverse research university with nationally-recognized faculty and programs.

More than 35,000 students attend UH in twelve colleges offering 278 undergraduate, graduate, and professional degrees. Students learn from faculty members who hold the Nobel Peace Prize, the Pulitzer Prize, Tony Awards, the National Medal of Science, and numerous national and international awards for their work in the arts, humanities, sciences, engineering, business, law, and social work.

Faculty members conduct nearly \$90 million in research in such vital areas as superconductivity, space commercialization, biomedical engineering, economics, biological sciences, education, and petroleum exploration. The university recently broke ground on an \$81 million Science and Engineering Research and Classroom Complex, to provide facilities for the many interdisciplinary research programs dealing with BioNanoTechnology.

UH has more than 300 partnerships with government and private industry and is the home of KUHT, the country's first PBS station; and KUHF, Houston's NPR station.

Outstanding academic programs mark every area of study at UH: the UH Creative Writing Program is ranked second in the nation by U.S. News & World Report and is one of the most competitive programs in the country and one of only two offering a Ph.D. The Conrad N. Hilton College of Hotel and Restaurant Management is the only school of its kind in Texas and is ranked third nationally.

The College of Liberal Arts and Social Sciences' doctoral psychology program is ranked second in Texas, with the psychology and the clinical neuropsychology programs among the top five in the nation, according to the National Research Council.

Students in the Moores School of Music consistently place first in regional and national competitions and the American Educational Research Association ranked the College of Education among the

top schools in the country in research productivity, with special recognition for the pioneering of innovative technologies for teaching and learning.

Six UH students from the UH Gerald D. Hines College of Architecture recently carned multiple awards in the International Competition of Ideas held in Milan and the Cullen College of Engineering's chemical engineering, mechanical engineering, and civil engineering programs are ranked among the top programs in the nation. A new undergraduate program in biomedical engineering, combined with recent strides in nanoengineering, have poised UH to become one of the premier players in bionano research.

The University of Houston's Bauer College of Business boasts the top entrepreneurship program in Texas and its accounting department consistently ranks first or second for Texas CPA exam pass rate. Additionally, the Bauer College is one of five U.S. schools with multiple members in the Academy of Management Hall of Fame and the marketing faculty is ranked in the top five percent worldwide.

The UH College of Pharmacy has partnered with the U.S. Food and Drug Administration in a cooperative effort unique in the nation, where students will help to develop and exchange scientific resources and educational opportunities.





The 550-acre UII campus abounds with parks, fountains, plazas, sculptures, trees and recreational fields. In 2003 the University opened one of the nation's largest and most advanced Campus Recreation and Wellness Centers. The Athletics Department at UII is truly world-class, with over 73 NCAA championships and 53 Olympians.

In addition to campus programs, the UH Distance Education program provides educational opportunities to students in outlying areas – the University of Houston is the largest university distance education program in Texas.

UH has awarded more than 200,000 degrees, and roughly 75 percent of alumni remain in the Houston metropolitan area. At the University of Houston students thrive and new knowledge is created to benefit future generations.

or more than 120 years, students from all over the world have come to The University of Texas at Austin to receive a first-class education. Students who once walked across campus have founded and led Fortune 1000 companies, received Nobel and Pulitzer Prizes, been presented with Academy Awards, hoisted Heisman Trophies and become Olympic gold medalists.

The University of Texas at Austin is recognized for its accomplishments in research, teaching, and public service. It is the flagship of the 15-campus University of Texas System. The university includes a main campus of more than 410 acres with more than 140 buildings.

In addition, the university maintains research centers across the state that place the university's faculty and students at the forefront of study in such areas as nanotechnology, robotics, geophysics, astronomy, marine science, history, literature, and engineering.

The discoveries that happen at the University of Texas impact people all over the world and a groundbreaking initiative called EUREKA (Enhancing Undergraduate Research, Experience, Knowledge, and Access) brings cutting edge research opportunities directly to undergraduate students – including freshmen. Students also experience centuries of history on campus by studying



prehistoric fossils at the Texas Memorial Museum, gazing at Renaissance and Baroque paintings in the Blanton Museum, thumbing through original manuscripts by Ernest Hemingway and T.S. Eliot at the Ransom Center, or reliving the turbulent 1960s with a visit through the Lyndon B. Johnson Library and Museum.

The faculty of UT Austin is composed of 2,721 professors and lecturers supported by approximately 2,947 assistant instructors and teaching assistants. They include the winner of the 1967 Pulitzer Prize in History; a recipient of the 1968 Enrico Fermi Award; the 1970, 1991, 1993, and 2000 National Medal of Science recipients; and the winner of the 1979 Nobel Prize in Physics. The university has 1,197 endowed academic positions – 279 chairs, 503 professorships, 21 visiting professorships, 127 lectureships, and 267 fellowships. From the efforts of individual faculty members to the work of 86 organized research units, scholarly inquiry covers a broad range of disciplines – literally spanning the known universe from the inner workings of atomic nuclei to the far reaches of space.

In addition to teaching and research responsibilities, faculty members maintain regular office hours and many serve as academic advisers to students. Although UT Austin is a large university, most classes are small enough to allow for considerable faculty and student interaction.

The university seeks to maintain a diverse student body united in its pursuit of higher education. In the 2004 fall semester, the university enrolled about 50,000 students from richly varied ethnic and geographic backgrounds. Every day UT graduates make a difference in their communities as volunteers, teachers, journalists, artists, engineers, business leaders, and lawyers. With world-renowned faculty, top-rated academic programs, successful alumni, and such an enticing location, it's no surprise that The University of Texas at Austin ranks among the best universities in the world.

2005 Interviews

April of 2005 brought the highlight of each Foundation year, when interview panels selected 169 new 2005 Scholars. The finalists came from every area of Texas to interviews held concurrently in Austin, Houston and Dallas.



TEXAS STATE UNIVERSITY



Located at the heart of campus, "Old Main" has long been the symbol of Texas State University-San Marcos.

exas State University-San Marcos is a doctoral granting university located in the burgeoning Austin-San Antonio corridor, the largest campus in the Texas State University System, and the sixth largest in the state.

Texas State's 26,827 students choose from 115 undergraduate, 84 master's, and 6 Ph.D. graduate degree programs offered by seven colleges – Applied Arts, Business Administration, Education, Fine Arts and Communication, Health Professions, Liberal Arts, and Science.

Authorized by the Texas Legislature in 1899, Southwest Texas State Normal School opened its doors in 1903. Over the years the Legislature broadened the institution's scope and changed its name, in succession, to Normal College, Teachers College,

College, University, and in 2003 to Texas State University-San Marcos. Each name reflects the university's growth from a small teacher preparation institution to a major, multipurpose university. Texas State's original mission was to prepare Texas public school teachers, especially those of south central Texas. It became renowned for carrying out this mission, but today it does far more.

As the university's student population has grown – from 303 in 1903 to 26,827 in 2004 – the campus, too, has expanded. The original 11-acre main campus has grown to 429 acres, plus an additional 4,200 off-site acres in ranching, farming, and a recreational camp. Major acquisitions include the 79-acre San Marcos Baptist Academy campus in 1978, 90-acre Aquarena Springs Resort in 1994, 125-acre University Camp on the Blanco River in 1951, and 3,485-acre Freeman Ranch in 1985.



Located on the edge of the Texas Hill Country, where blackland prairies turn in to beautiful hills, Texas State enjoys a setting that is unique among Texas universities. The beauty of the crystal-clear San Marcos River and the stately cypress and pecan trees on the campus add to the charm of its

picturesque setting. The campus is in San Marcos, a community about halfway between Austin and San Antonio. Its location on the banks of the San Marcos River provides recreational and leisure activities for students throughout the year.

Texas State is nationally recognized for excellence in many academic disciplines. The Geography Department has been ranked the largest and one of the best programs in the nation for many years by the American Association of Geographers. Faculty members in geography, communication studies, business, mathematics and mass communication have been recognized as the best in the nation in their fields. Fourteen faculty members have been honored as Piper Professors, an annual recognition of the top college faculty in the state.

Student teams in debate, advertising, and free enterprise routinely place high in national competitions. The Students in Free Enterprise (SIFE) team won the international competition in 2000 against 700 teams from 15 countries and has placed among the top





20 for eight straight years. The American Advertising Federation student team claimed its second national title win in 2005.

Texas State students in jazz, marching and concert band, symphony, choirs, instrumental ensembles, mariachis and steel drum band maintain schedules of performances across the state and the world. The jazz program has been featured for years at the Mentreux (Switzerland) Jazz Festival. The sound recording technology program, housed at Texas State's unique Fire Station Studio, is the only degree program of its kind in the Southwest.

With a diverse campus community including more than 26 percent of the student body from ethnic minorities, Texas State is one of the top 20 producers of Hispanic baccalaureate graduates in the nation.

Texas State is also the lead institution of a multi-institution teaching center offering several programs in the greater north Austin area. There are 1,586 students enrolled at the Round Rock Higher Education Center.

The university has granted well over 100,000 degrees over the years. Alumni include Lyndon Johnson, Class of 1930, making Texas State the only Texas institution – and one of only 29 colleges nationwide – to have graduated an American president. Texas State alumni have become leaders in business, education, entertainment, media, literature, the military, law enforcement, government, agriculture, technology, science, sports, law, and health care.

exas A&M University, the Lone Star State's first public institution of higher learning, is one of a select few universities in the nation to boast triple Land-Grant, Sea-Grant, and Space-Grant status.

The 129-year-old university is located in College Station, a medium-sized community approximately equidistant from the state's major metropolitan areas. Its 5,200-acre campus is one of the largest in the nation, and is the home of the George Bush Presidential Library and Museum, which opened in November of 1997.

Texas A&M has long been known nationally for its school spirit and traditions, including the fact that its students stand throughout football games as the Twelfth Man to symbolize their willingness to suit up and play if needed. More recently, it has expanded its reputation to include national recognition for attracting top students, innovative research programs and exceptional academic

programs in a host of areas. In recognition of its strong academic and related research programs, Texas A&M is one of 62 invited members of the prestigious American Association of Universities. It also is home to a chapter of Phi Beta Kappa, the oldest and most respected undergraduate honor society in the nation.

The university's student body includes some of the country's brightest men and women. Texas A&M, for example, has consistently ranked among the nation's top schools in enrollment of new National Merit Scholars. More than 17,000 students hold scholarships, including about 2,500 with major four-year academic scholarships.

Texas A&M continues to have the state's best graduation rates for any public university for the overall student body, and for African-American and Hispanic students. Its improving graduation rates represent the bucking of a national trend. With 44,435 students as of the fall 2004 semester, Texas A&M ranked as the nation's

seventh-largest university. Among those students are more than 8,000 graduate and professional-school students. Students hail from all 50 states and more than 120 foreign countries.

Although military training has not been mandatory for more than a quarter of a century, some 1,800 young men and women still choose to participate in the university's Corps of Cadets. The Corps continues to commission more military officers than any institution, except the service academies.

Texas A&M ranks among the top 10 universities nationally in endowment value, reflecting its ability to support world-class faculty and facilities and other aspects of the academic process. The faculty includes a Nobel Laureate, two winners of the National Medal of Science, and more than 25 members of either the National Academy of Sciences or the National Academy of Engineering. The university's campus has numerous state-of-theart laboratories and research facilities, including a research cyclotron, now one of only three of its caliber in the world. The university also has a leading chemical characterization center and various installations that enable it to be in the forefront in biotechnology and numerous other disciplines in the life and physical sciences and in engineering.

The research work of an outstanding faculty in exceptional facilities places Texas A&M high in rankings of major universities by the National Science Foundation. The most recent NSF ranking placed Texas A&M among the top 20, and the value of the university's research has grown to more than \$500 million annually. The research projects supported by that funding encompass all of the university's academic colleges: agriculture and life sciences,

architecture, business, education, engineering, geosciences, liberal arts, science, and veterinary medicine. Homeland security figures prominently in several new programs at Texas A&M with multi-million dollar federal funding support.

Not to be limited by state or national boundaries, Texas A&M is firmly committed to a global reach and perspective. Its international outreach efforts include memoranda of understanding with more than 85 foreign institutions and organizations throughout the world. It opened a branch campus in Qatar in 2003. All costs for building and operating the engineering-oriented campus in the Persian Gulf country are being paid by the Qatar Foundation for Education, Science and Community Development. In addition, Texas A&M operates the Santa Chiara Study Center in Castiglion Fiorentino, Italy, and a facility in

Mexico City. Also, many College Station-based multi-disciplinary groups are devoted to enhancing research and scholarship opportunities both at home and abroad.

ABOUT THE FOUNDERS

Howard L. Terry

Native Texan Howard L. Terry was born in Milam County in 1916. He attended the University of Texas on an athletic scholarship and earned his B.B.A. in 1938. He was employed by Procter & Gamble until 1942, when he entered the U.S. Navy and served as

a P.T. Boat commander in the Pacific during World War II. He later returned to Procter & Gamble, from which he was recruited to set up a chain of appliance stores, serving as General Manager until 1951. At that time, Terry went into business for himself in lumber, building, and development, building several residential subdivisions in Texas and other states.

Over the following years, Terry founded several businesses in various fields, including Business Funds, Marathon Manufacturing, Crutcher Resources, Allied Bancshares, and Farm & Home Savings. Beginning in 1979, he became

a director and chairman of the executive committee of Penn Central Corp., a position he held until 1986. In 1981, he founded the Terry Companies, a multi-state corporation involved in oil & gas exploration and development.

Howard and Nancy Terry are both long time residents of Houston, Texas. Mr. Terry enjoys golf and is actively involved in the operations of the Terry Companies and the Terry Foundation. Despite his series of remarkable success in business endeavors in many fields, he often refers to the Terry Foundation as his finest achievement.
